



UNICEF High School Club Member Position Description

UNICEF High School Clubs are driven by students who know they have a vital role to play in helping the world's children survive. Clubs partner with the U.S. Fund for UNICEF to educate, advocate, and fundraise — work that is vital to UNICEF's ability to save children in 150 countries around the globe. Clubs produce benefit concerts and other fundraisers, write letters to elected officials, participate in Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF and UNICEF Tap Project campaigns, and write school newspaper editorials.

Students wishing to pursue a membership position with a UNICEF High School Club should be prepared to make this role an important extracurricular priority and requires a commitment of time and energy to both individual work and productive collaboration.

This position offers student leaders a unique and exciting opportunity to shape the course their club while gaining valuable experience about UNICEF and global humanitarian affairs.

UNICEF High School Club membership responsibilities:

- Learn about UNICEF's work in more than 150 countries and territories. In areas from nutrition to child protection, HIV/AIDS to education, no other organization surpasses UNICEF's vast experience, extensive resources, global presence, and perspective in helping save children's lives.
- Help your club plan and implement education, advocacy, and fundraising activities at your school and in your community on behalf of UNICEF.
- Use the UNICEF High School Club Online Activity Calendar which will guide your club's education and fundraising activities
- Attend and actively participate in membership meetings and, if applicable, participate in leadership committees.
- Participate in local volunteer opportunities, trainings, and other special events. While not mandatory, participation in these opportunities is highly encouraged for the continual enrichment of the leadership team and program.
- Participate in unique UNICEF High School Club tailored opportunities offered by the U.S. Fund for UNICEF. These are projects where club members will develop project management, communication and leadership skills.

Qualifications:

- Members should be committed to increasing awareness on humanitarian issues and UNICEF's work and motivated to taking action to address those.
- Members should exhibit strong leadership skills or potential and should be able to take initiative on a number of projects.
- Excellent communication skills are a must. Individuals should feel comfortable speaking in front of a group of peers and possess skills in group facilitation.
