



Club Member/Volunteer Position Description

High School Club members are an integral part of a vast network of volunteers across the United States that increases awareness about global humanitarian issues, advocates on behalf of UNICEF, and raises or leverages funds the US Fund for UNICEF. Students wishing to pursue a leadership or member position with the UNICEF High School should be prepared to make this role an **important extracurricular priority**. A High School Club membership position requires a commitment of time and energy to both individual work and productive collaboration.

This position offers student leaders a unique and exciting opportunity to shape the course their High School Club while gaining valuable experience about UNICEF and global humanitarian affairs.

High School Club membership responsibilities:

- Help to plan and implement education, advocacy, and fundraising activities at your school and in your community on behalf of UNICEF.
- Register as an official member with your high school club by visiting www.unicefusa.org/highschoolclubs and selecting "Register Club Members" (please note: you will not be able to register with your high school club until the club has submitted an official registration page and received confirmation from the US Fund for UNICEF).
- Use the Online Volunteer Center to post events on the Calendar of Events and summaries of events on the Bulletin Board. Use the available downloadable resources.
- Maintain political impartiality on issues when representing UNICEF and, when asked, participate in UNICEF-sponsored public policy concerns.
- Attend and actively participate in weekly (or biweekly) membership meetings and, if applicable, participate in leadership committees.
- On occasion, High School Club members may be asked to participate in local volunteer opportunities, trainings, and other special events.

Qualifications:

- Members should be motivated to improve the experience of the world's children.
- Members should exhibit strong leadership skills or potential and should be able to take initiative on a number of projects.

Excellent communication skills are a must. Individuals should feel comfortable speaking in front of a group of peers and possess skills in group facilitation.
